# Bulldogs' defense dominates Blue Dukes

Whitefish Bay - The Cedarburg defense doesn't rest.

Following a pair of shutouts against Menomonee Falls and Germantown, the Bulldogs faced a test Friday night against a dangerous Whitefish Bay offense led by senior quarterback Jimmy Sherburne.

Consider that test aced.

Cedarburg, ranked eighth in the area, forced a pair of fumbles and intercepted three passes on the way to an impressive 42-7 North Shore Conference victory.

Team unity has been huge this year and the coaching has been great. We've just been trying to build every game."

So much so, that a unit that had been seen as a liability for the Highlanders at the start of the season is now a strength, as Homestead improved to 7-0 overall and 5-0 in the North Shore Conference. Johnson and the line overpowered the smaller Bay (4-3, 3-2) defense, which was without injured defensive back Nick Desien.

"That just tore us up in coverage," Blue Duke coach Jim Tietjen said. "We couldn't sub in as often as we would have liked. We had to use 15 guys on defense. ..As a team, I don't think we'll watch this film. The coaches will though. We'll look at it carefully and try to make some adjustments."

The Highlanders made adjustments at will, taking advantage of a botched Bay punt on the first series to go 29 yards in seven plays, as Aric Daniels (8 carries-67 yards), who would find the end zone three times on the night, barreled up the middle from seven yards out for the first score of the night.

Homestead's second score came at the end of a 97-yard drive, the first of two 90-plus yard efforts on the night, as Daniels broke out of a scrum and caromed his way 37 yards for a TD.

Barnes threw the first of his two TD passes three series later as back Bryan Bronaugh caught a pass in the flat, made three Bay defenders miss and raced in from 30 yards out. Bronaugh would finish with three catches for 95 yards.

And as to emphasize that point, Daniels took the ball on a reverse from Mike Collins on the second half kickoff and raced virtually untouched 86 yards for a touchdown. Two series later, Walker exploded off the left side for a 51-yard scoring jaunt to finish the night for the starting offense.

The outburst was more than enough for the focused starting defense, which limited the pass-happy Bay squad to 191 total yards, as all-state lineman Shelby Harris had two sacks and one fumble recovery.

"We always try to keep our heads on straight," Harris said. "Nothing's on our minds except what we have to do the next game. That's the goal and the motivation that keeps us going."

Bay's quarterback Jimmy Sherburne got off to a fiery start, completing 24 of 35 passes for 300 yards with two touchdowns and one interception, but it was


not enough.
